- Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA.
- Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA minimum requirement of 2.00 for this program.
- The [Carolina Core](#) provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
- Students in the College of Engineering and Computing are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the 121 course by either 1) scoring two or better on the foreign language placement test; or 2) completion of the 109 and 110 courses in one foreign language or completion of the 121 course in another foreign language.
- The IIT curriculum includes 2-14 hours of approved (free) electives, depending on how students fulfill the Carolina Core requirements. Any course in the university can be used to satisfy the elective requirement (including additional electives in the major). Although not required, UNIV 101 is a recommended elective for all students in their first semester attending University of South Carolina.
- Internship coordinated by a faculty member and supervised by an approved business supervisor. Internship agreement approval by supervisor and instructor is required.
- IITEC Elective** (3 hours): IITEC 475, IITEC 476, IITEC 544, IITEC 545, IITEC 562, IITEC 570, IITEC 586, IITEC 590

Program Notes:

- Courses designated as “critical” (!) may affect time to graduation due to prerequisite requirements for subsequent required courses.
- In order to satisfy the requirements for a degree in Integrated Information Technology and regardless of other satisfactory work, a student may not take an IITEC course more than two times. For this purpose, withdrawal from a course with a grade of **W** is not regarded as enrollment in that course.
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree and at least half of the major must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina-Columbia.
